- Q1. What are six (6) of the 10 American Kennel Club's Canine Good Citizen® test items? – Pg 52  
1. Accepting a friendly stranger, 2. Sitting politely for petting, 3. Appearance and Grooming, 4. Walking on a loose lead, 5. Walking through a crowd, 6. Sit and Down on command/Staying in place, 7. Coming when called, 8. Reaction to another dog, 9. Reaction to distractions, 10. Supervised separation
- Q2. Name the six (6) most common internal parasites of dogs. – Pg. 144-147  
Roundworms, hookworms, whipworms, tapeworms, heartworms, giardia
- Q3. How is ringworm transmitted from a dog to a human? – Pg 151  
Direct contact with an infected animal, contact with an object that is contaminated with the spores
- Q4. What are the ranges of a dog's normal vital signs for temperature, heart rate, and respiration? Pg. 154  
Temperature 100.5 – 102.5  
Heart Rate 60 – 160 beats per minute  
Respiration 10 – 30 breaths per minute
- Q5. Name 5 of the signs of stress in a dog. – Pg. 47, 48  
Whining, excessive vocalizations, hackles raised along back, dilated pupils, turning head away, avoiding eye contact, shaking, excessive shedding, excessive dandruff, sweaty paws, refusal to eat, diarrhea, vomiting, hiding, distracted or restless, inappropriate urination or defecation.
- Q6-Q15 – Know these definitions: Glossary Pg. 171 - 176  
Apple Head: A rounded or domed skull.  
Dewclaws: The extra toe and nail on the inside of the dog's leg.  
Cardiac Muscles: Specialized muscles that form the heart.  
Incisors: Front teeth of each jaw between the canines, six upper and six lower.  
Cryptorchid: A condition in the male in which the testicles have not descended into the scrotum  
Brindle: An even mixture of black hair and hairs of lighter colors  
Gestation: The length of pregnancy, from fertilization to whelping  
Splay Foot: A flat foot with toes spread little cushion and often crooked nails.  
Flews: Loose hanging upper lip.  
Pad: Thick, tough cover of the paw cushion
- Q16. What turns into what: Pg. 134  
Carbohydrates turn into simple sugars  
Fat turn into Fatty acids  
Proteins turn into Amino acids
- Q17. The Endocrine System is made up of glands and other tissues that manufacture hormones such as thyroid, insulin, testosterone, and estrogen. – Pg 134
- Q 18. The dolichocephalic head shape has a narrow skull and elongated muzzle. These dogs have long necks and a body build that is agile and swift. Breeds such as the Saluki, Collie and Greyhound are examples – Pg 130

Q 19. The mesocephalic skull has a wider skull base with a long face and is characteristic of retrievers and spaniels – Pg 130

Q20. The brachycephalic skull , which has a broad skull base and short muzzle, can be found in the Boxer. In breeds like the Pekingese, Boston Terrier, Pug, and Bulldog, the structure of the brachycephalic skull is taken to its extreme and the muzzle virtually disappears. Pg 131
